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




CELEBRATING SENIORS' ACHIEVEMENTS




Hands-on Lesson in the Viking Science Lab






















ILATHLETE OF THE WEEK NORTHEAST 4X100M RELAY PUBLIC SCHOOLS





Congratulations to the Northeast Vikings 4x100 Meter Relay team for breaking the school record, previously set in 2013. with a time of 44.09 seconds. The relay team, consisting of seniors Dawon Lacey and Shalmar'e Wade and juniors DeJohn Bailey and Darcel Sisson, placed 2nd in the Class 3, District 8 Meet, earning them a trip to Sectionals. Sisson also broke the school record in the 400M with a time of 50.48 seconds.

On the girls side, junior Rayonna Gibson took 1st place in the 33" 100M Hurdles, breaking the school record with a time of 16.05 seconds. Fellow junior Nyrie Allen broke the school record in javelin with a throw of 83' 1.75", good for 7th in the Class 3, District 8 Finals.











